ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

A maximum of four standard classes may be scheduled for any dog on an individual day of competition. Any number of special classes may be scheduled.

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for a maximum of three consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will be determined by the eligibility for the class as referenced in H(1)(A)11. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade. To count for progression wins must be gained in standard classes at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows. Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Competitors will be allowed to walk the course set at Small, Medium, Intermediate or Large height without their dog(s) before the class begins.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers). A minimum of 50 points must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes in the relevant grade. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

Standard Classes

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1 the two wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply to only one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 Open to owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a minimum of two first places at Grade 1 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, at least one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class. N.B Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2 Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1, or have elected to progress on points from Grade 1 and are not eligible for grades 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7.

Grade 3 Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of two first places at Grade 2 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) classes, or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of three first places at Grade 3 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, or have elected to progress on points from Grade 3 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 4 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of five first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6.

Special Classes

Societies may schedule classes other than those defined above as "Special Classes". The eligibility for "Special" Classes must be defined by the Society and included in the schedule. The word "Special" must be included in the title of the class. Where classes are classified for older and/or inexperienced dogs, the height of the hurdles, the A-Ramp and the dog walk, and the length of the long jump, may be reduced below the dimensions specified in these regulations, in which case such dimensions must be included in the class definition in the show schedule.

Marking for special classes may deviate from marking for standard classes, but must be specified in the schedule. Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club Shows.

Rules and Regulations

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the competitor.
3. Entry fees £4.20 per dog per class. Camping £13 per night, Day camping £6.50 per day. Working members will be refunded to the equivalent of £20.00 per member per day.
4. There is no prize money at this show.
5. Entries will only be accepted on the official form or photocopy thereof. Entries may also be made via the internet at www.agilityshows.online
6. The Committee reserves the right to itself to refuse entries.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club Licensed Shows.
8. A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes.
9. Organisers of open agility shows may set a capping level on the entries to be accepted in any standard or special class, and may decline entries received after the capping level has been reached.
10. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
11. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
12. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden.
13. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
14. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A single flat, close fitting collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
15. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
16. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
17. Thank you to our sponsors: Adams Agility Equipment and Crystal Vision Awards
18. Kennel Club standard marking regulations apply for all standard classes.
19. The height of hurdles for Anysize/Veterans classes will be 400mm, 300 and 200mm (Dogs run at height of handlers' choice). Results will be combined
20. The Height limit for dogs:
 - a. Large Dog classes - For Dogs measuring over 500mm at the withers
 - b. Intermediate Dog classes - For Dogs measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers
 - c. Medium Dog classes - For dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers.
 - d. Small Dog classes – For dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers.
21. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter a dog for competition, which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or are resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
22. Removal of dogs from Competition:

Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:

 - a) A bitch, which is in season.
 - b) Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c) Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d) Of such temperament or so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or any other animal.
 - e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.

The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the show Incident Book and submitted to the Kennel Club.
23. Dog Agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in Agility classes on the day of the show.
24. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition (4th April 2022) shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitors' responsibility to notify the show secretary, or the show processor, at least 14 days before the date of the show (14th April 2022). The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding class number as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
25. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.

26. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club/society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
27. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring. Competitors are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilst under test.
28. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
29. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
30. Passes are not required to gain entry to the show/showground.
31. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A11.
32. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
33. Animals in Event No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Board. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
34. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
35. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
36. Welfare of Dogs
An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any Agility show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and within the precincts of the show.
37. All dogs entered at this show are at the owner's risk. Whilst every care will be taken, the Committee and Organisers will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury, however caused to persons, dogs or property at the show.
38. Overpaid entries will NOT be refunded.
39. Competitors must follow the instructions of the Stewards with respect to parking and conduct within the show boundaries and any person directing abuse will be removed from the showground.
40. Goods may NOT be sold within the precincts of the show without prior permission of the committee.
41. Training equipment is not allowed within the gardens and camping/exercise areas.
42. DOGS ARE NOT TO BE LEFT LOOSE IN 'GARDEN' AREAS OR TETHERED TO VEHICLES WITHOUT BEING ATTENDED.
43. Please pick up after your dog and deposit the waste in the bags/bins provided. If you fail to clean up after your dog, you will be asked to leave the venue.
44. No refunds after closing date other than exceptional circumstances, and at the committee's discretion.
45. Rosettes and Trophies will NOT be forwarded.
46. If choosing to download your ring cards you are agreeing to your running orders for this show being available to the public on the web site.
47. Courses. No practice is allowed on the course save that competitors will be allowed to walk the course, to negotiate without their dog(s) before the class begins.
48. Obstacles - Hurdle-The height of the hurdle must be 600mm for Large Dogs, 500mm for Intermediate Dogs 400mm for Medium Dogs and 300mm for Small Dogs.
49. Children under the age of 11 are the responsibility of and must be accompanied at all times by a parent or guardian including when competing.
50. No bikes around the rings and camping area and woodland walk.
51. No ball/toy throwing around the rings, no clickers or squeaky toys around the rings.
52. No tannoy announcements before 10am, briefings will be ringside.
53. No emptying of caravan toilet waste in toilets, elsan points are provided, no washing of toilet cassettes under drinking water taps.
54. GENERATORS – Hours of use restricted to between 8 am and 8 pm. Please be considerate to your neighbours while using a generator.
55. Please do not attend this show if you are exhibiting signs of Covid 19, Temperatures may be taken on arrival.

The Heats

- There will be five qualifying heats throughout the year. These will be open to all Large, Intermediate, Medium and Small dogs who compete in standard KC classes. They will consist of two qualifying rounds. One KC standard jumping class and one KC standard agility class. The classes will be set as C1-4 and C5-7. The top ten dog and handler partnerships with the most accumulated points over the 2 rounds will go through to an invitation Semi-final on the day. To achieve points, you must enter both classes. Rosettes and Trophies for the two qualifying rounds will be as per the schedule.
- In the event of a tie for the last place, the time/ faults will be considered for both qualifying rounds to determine the last qualifying place. The calculation to determine the last place is: Firstly, the dog with the least course faults in both agility and jumping rounds. If these are still equal the dog with the fastest combined time will qualify.
- Points will be awarded for placings in the agility and jumping rounds as follows:

Agility: 1st place = 20 points, 2nd place = 19 points etc. down to a maximum of 10th place. Unplaced Clear rounds = 2 points

Jumping: 1st place = 10 points, 2nd place = 9 points etc. down to a maximum of 10th place. Unplaced Clear rounds = 1 points

Elimination in either round will exclude you from the semi-final. (Not competing in one part of the competition will mean you are not eligible for the semi-final, but points can be accumulated for the Grand - Final).

- The semi-final will consist of a Special Invitation Agility Class, this will be held on the same day as each of the heats, after the show is closed. The Semi Final will be run over a standard set of Agility Equipment, but may also include a Wall, Tyre and Long Jump. Competitors will be notified during the day, after the qualifying heats have finished, who will be in the Semi-final. It is the competitors responsibility to check if they have made it through to the Semi-final and to book in to confirm that they will be running. Reserves will be taken if necessary.
- The winners and runners up of the semi -finals will receive a trophy and a rosette. Every Dog and Handler Partnership that runs in the Semi-final will receive an extra 2 points

The Grand-Final

- The points gained from the Agility, Jumping and Semi-final rounds from all the heats will be entered into a league table. The top 25 dogs from each category will be invited to the Grand –Final.
- In the event of a tie for the last place, the time/ faults will be taken into account for all qualifying rounds to determine the last qualifying place. The calculation to determine the last place is: Firstly, the dog with the least course faults in both agility and jumping rounds. If these are still equal the dog with the fastest combined time will qualify.
- The Grand – Final will be held at Agility Vision on the August Bank holiday weekend at Catton Park, DE12 8LN. This will be an Agility class and run over a standard set of Agility Equipment, but may also include a Wall, Tyre and Long Jump.
- Handlers will be notified that they have qualified for the final. It is the handlers responsibility to confirm that they will be attending the Grand-Final. Reserves will be called if necessary.
- Dogs and handlers qualify as a Partnership and will not be allowed to interchange. If for example a dog is handled by different handlers at different heats, they will gain points for that partnership separate from the previous handler. The Handler with the highest points for that dog, if placed in the top 25, will be the handler invited to compete in the Grand-Finals. The dog may only qualify once for the Grand-Final and can only take part in one of the finals. If a dog accumulates enough points to qualify for the C1-4 Final and the C5-7 final, the higher-grade final will take priority. A handler can qualify multiple dogs, but a dog can only qualify with one handler.
- **The winners of the Grand-finals in each height and grade category will receive a rosette, trophy and an Adams Agility Voucher to the value of £ 1,000.00**

Crystal Vision Large/Intermediate Agility Qualifier Rules

Crystal Vision Agility Qualifiers to be held throughout the year with the Final being held at Agility Vision , in August 2022 at Catton Park (DE12 8LN). The top ten dogs in each heat will collect points towards qualification to the Final. If a heat would need to be split into two parts, subject to the number of dogs entered (exciding KC maximums), this would mean a duplicate of prizes, with the first ten handlers and dogs in each part collecting points towards the final.

The course design should be open and flowing.

The prize for the final will be a £ 50.00 Crystal Vision Voucher for the Grade 1-4 winner and a £ 50.00 Crystal Vision Voucher for the Grade 5-7 winner.

Trophies and rosettes to second place in the final, keepsake for all that have qualified.

Crystal Vision Final – Rules & Regulations

1. Eligibility for the competition under the Kennel Club classification and open to dogs working large/intermediate height grades 1-4 and 5-7 (separate qualifiers and final). The competition must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the event.
2. Competitors entering the competition must be deemed to have agreed to abide by KC Rules and Regulations.
3. Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Each large/intermediate heat is open to all competitors eligible for grades 1-4 and separately 5-7.
4. The top ten dogs in each heat and height will collect points (i.e. 10 points for 1st place,... 1point for 10th place)
5. The top 20dogs from the Large and Intermediate in Grades 1-4 and 5-7 will be invited to the Final in August 2022 at Catton Park.
6. Rosettes in qualifiers will be presented to the top 6 places, trophies to 3rd place.

Crystal Vision Medium /Small Agility Qualifier Rules

Crystal Vision Agility Qualifiers to be held throughout the year with the Final being held at Agility Vision , August 2022 at Catton Park (DE12 8LN). The top ten dogs in each heat will collect points towards qualification to the Final. If a heat would need to be split into two parts, subject to the number of dogs entered (exciding KC maximums), this would mean a duplicate of prizes, with the first ten handlers and dogs in each part collecting points towards the final.

The course design should be open and flowing.

The prize for the final will be a £ 50.00 Crystal Vision Voucher for the Small Finals winner and a £ 50.00 Crystal Vision Voucher for the Medium Finals winner.

Trophies and rosettes to second place in the final, keepsake for all that have qualified.

Crystal Vision Final – Rules & Regulations

1. Eligibility for the competition under the Kennel Club classification and open to dogs working small/medium height grades 1-7 (separate qualifiers and final). The competition must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the event.
2. Competitors entering the competition must be deemed to have agreed to abide by KC Rules and Regulations.
3. Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Each small/medium heat is open to all competitors eligible for grades 1-7.
4. The top ten dogs in each heat and height will collect points (i.e. 10 points for 1st place,... 1point for 10th place)
5. The top 20dogs from the Small and Medium height in Grades 1-7 will be invited to the Final in August 2022 at Catton Park.
6. Rosettes in qualifiers will be presented to the top 4 places, trophies to 2nd place.

Awards and Rosettes

1st place Awards in a class with entries from 1 up to 29

Awards for 1st and 2nd place in a class with entries between 30 and 59

Awards for 1st 2nd and 3rd in classes with entries of 60 and over

Rosettes to 10% of entry in all classes

Clear round rosettes for all classes

EXERCISE AREA

Please exercise your dogs in the areas provided on site, anyone found not picking up after their dogs may be asked to leave the show site immediately. The exercise area will be clearly marked; please do not allow your dog off lead anywhere other than the designated exercise area. Only 3 dogs permitted off lead and UNDER CONTROL at any time per person. You must adhere to the one way system on the river walk.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show and your dog is left in the vehicle regular checks must be undertaken to ensure the wellbeing of the dog(s).
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog always stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated and this could lead to dire results.

Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED. Special Classes

Anysize/Veteran Jumping (Special)

Open to all dogs not entered in any other classes at this show

Class A – Anysize is for dogs under 9 years of age at the first day of the show

Class B – Veterans is for dogs aged 9 years and over at the first day of the show

Classes A and B will be run as one class, but with separate results. Dogs may only be entered in either category A or B, according to age. The jump heights for all dogs will be set at 400mm, 300mm and 200mm, the height the dog jumps is at the handlers discretion. The course will not contain a tyre, weaves, wishing well or wall. The course time will be 60 seconds. All heights of dogs will compete against each other over the same course at the dogs chosen jump height with one set of awards. The course will be very simple and flowing.

Circular Jumping 1-3 and 4-7 (Special)

Open to all dogs competing in Grades 1-3 and 4-7 (Anysize and Veterans excluded). The object of this class is to negotiate a course made up with only jumps (excluding the tyre) and tunnels (no weaves) with a minimum of 17 and a maximum of 20 obstacles. The course should be of a circular layout, fast flowing and straight forward.

Directions to the venue
