CLASSES

Class One

(Special) Small Agility grades 1 to 3 (Combined)*

Class Two

(Special) Small Agility grades 4 to 5 (Combined)*

Class Three

(Special) Small Agility grades 6 to 7 (Combined)*

Class Four

(Special) Small Jumping grades 1 to 3 (Combined)*

Class Five

(Special) Small Jumping grades 4 to 5 (Combined)*

Class Six

(Special) Small Jumping grades 6 to 7 (Combined)*

Class Seven

(Special) Small Steeplechase grades 1 to 7 (Combined)*

*These classes offer LHO with separate awards.

Jump Heights – 35cm (1ft 1.75ins)

LHO – 25 cms (9.8 ins)

Proposed order of judging - As stated above.

Rosettes – To minimum 5th place in each class

Trophies to third place in all classes

ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

A maximum of four standard classes may be scheduled for any dog on an individual day of competition. Any number of special classes may be scheduled.

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for a maximum of three consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will be determined by the eligibility for the class as referenced in H(1)(A)11. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade. To count for progression wins must be gained in standard classes at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows. Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers). A minimum of 50 points must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes in the relevant grade. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the two wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1

Open to owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a minimum of two first places at Grade 1 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, at least one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class. N.B Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 are not eligible for this class.

Grade 2

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 1 and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7.

Grade 3

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of two first places at Grade 2 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class, or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of three first places at Grade 3 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping classes), or have elected to progress on points from Grade 3 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7

Grade 5

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 4 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 6 or 7

Grade 6

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of five first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6.

SPECIAL CLASSES

Societies may schedule classes other than those defined above as “Special classes”. The eligibility for “Special” classes must be defined by the Society and included in the schedule. The word “Special” must be included in the title of the class. Where special classes are classified for older and/or inexperienced dogs, the height of the hurdles, the A-ramp, and the dog walk, and the length of the long jump, may be reduced below the dimensions specified in these regulations, in which case such dimensions must be included in the class definition in the show schedule.

Marking for special classes may deviate from marking for standard classes, but must be specified in the schedule. Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of five first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6.

Steeplechase Jumping Grades 1–7 – A jumping course consisting of jumps and tunnels only. No weaves to be used in this class.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/authority to compete (ATC) will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries made without a Kennel Club registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. Entry fee £3.25 per dog per class
4. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
5. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of the Show are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Tests.
6. Dogs which have won an Agility Certificate or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Agility Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club are not eligible for entry in special classes at Limited Agility Shows or in Agility Matches.
7. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
8. A dog must not compete in the same class more than once, including special classes
9. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden.
11. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
12. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A single flat close fitting leather or webbing collar is permitted providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
13. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
14. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the Judge or Judges.
15. Kennel Club standard marking regulations apply for all standard classes
16. The height limit for dogs – Small dog classes – for dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
17. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership or handle a dog at the show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judges spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.

18. Withdrawal Removal of Dogs from Competition

Following discussion between show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be withdrawn from competition, prevented from competing and/or removed from the show if it is

- a. A bitch which is in season
- b. Suffering from any infectious disease or contagious disease
- c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent
- d. Of such temperament or so much out of hand is so much out of control as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
- e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.

The circumstances of such removal shall be recorded in the Competition/Show incident book and submitted to the Kennel Club

19. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25th June 2019, 25 days before the start of the competition, shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitors responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
20. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.
21. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances the society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so competitors will be refunded in the manner which they had entered the show but in any event the society will refund fees in 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
22. Except for mobility aids nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to a dog whilst in the ring. Competitors are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilst under test.
23. Should the judge deem a re-run is required any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted
24. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.
25. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dog suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A11.
26. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
27. Animals in Event
No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance except any dogs registered to assist the disabled or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Board. However, at the discretion of the society a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
28. No prize money will be given.
29. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits
30. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for completion at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
31. Dog Agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the owner / handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in Agility classes on the day of the show.
32. Welfare of Dogs
An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licenced event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not knowingly put their dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any Agility show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and within the precincts of the show.
33. If you enter the show by paper entry form and choose to download your ring cards you are agreeing for the information on them to be publicly viewable online.
34. The show organisers or their authorised agents may make results from this show publicly available and share results with third parties for the same purpose.

CATERING

There will be catering facilities on site.

CAMPING

Camping is available throughout the weekend from 12 noon Friday through to 12 noon Monday. For motorhomes, caravans and tents for motorhomes and caravans £10 per night and £8 per night for tents. There are showers available together with an Elsan point and stand pipe. Please enter the number of nights you wish to camp on the entry form where indicated.

PAPILLON CLUB PAPFEST


This agility show is run as part of the Papillon (Butterfly Dog) Clubs Fun Day. A full schedule of events throughout the day is not yet available but may include seminars, demonstrations, games etc. At the same time as the agility show, the Club will be holding an open breed show, restricted to papillons.

On no account will entries be accepted without fees. If a dog is in the process of Registration or Transfer at the time entry is made, add the letters NAF or TAF as appropriate after its name. Please put classes in numerical order and USE BLOCK CAPITALS throughout when completing this entry form. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Any bank charges incurred through incorrectly completed or dishonoured cheques will be passed on to the owner concerned. The Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC Number) for dogs resident outside of the UK must be stated or the entry will be returned. **PLEASE CHECK ALL DETAILS BEFORE POSTING.
