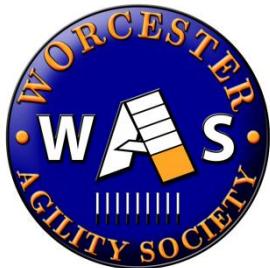

**Allocation of judges to classes may change when final entry numbers are known.**

### ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Standard classes may be scheduled for Agility Shows, as Agility classes or Jumping classes. All standard classes must contain the Weaving Poles obstacle. Standard Agility classes must contain the following elements: "A Ramp", Dog Walk and See-Saw. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:-

A maximum of four standard classes may be scheduled for any dog on an individual day of competition. Any number of special classes may be scheduled.

**Class Structure.** A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for a maximum of three consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

**Progression.** Progression from each Grade will be determined by the eligibility for the class as referenced in H(1)(A)11. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade. To count for progression wins must be gained in standard classes at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows. Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Competitors will be allowed to walk the course set at Small, Medium, Intermediate or Large height without their dog(s) before the class begins.

**Points Progression.** At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme (Regulation K3.c refers), A minimum of 50 points must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes in the relevant grade. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

**Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade on points once the entries have closed.**

### STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the two wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not to an accumulation of dogs.

**Grade 1:** Open to owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a minimum of two first places at Grade 1 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, at least one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class. N.B Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 are not eligible for this class.

**Grade 2:** Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 1 and are not eligible for Grades 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7.

**Grade 3:** Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of two first places at Grade 2 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an agility (not jumping) class, or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 4, 5, 6 or 7.

**Grade 4:** Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of three first places at Grade 3 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping classes), or have elected to progress on points from Grade 3 and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7

**Grade 5:** Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 4 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 6 or 7

**Grade 6:** Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, two of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 7.

**Grade 7:** Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of five first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows, three of which must have been gained in agility (not jumping) classes, and are not eligible for Grades 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6.

## **SPECIAL CLASSES**

Societies may schedule classes other than those defined above as “Special classes”. The eligibility for “Special” classes must be defined by the Society and included in the schedule. The word “Special” must be included in the title of the class. Where special classes are classified for older and/or inexperienced dogs, the height of the hurdles the A-ramp, and the dog walk and the length of the long jump, may be reduced below the dimensions specified in these regulations, in which case such dimensions must be included in the class definition in the show schedule.

Marking for special classes may deviate from marking for standard classes, but must be specified in the schedule. Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.

**Special Class: Jewlnick Jump and Twist Pairs (Class 46):** see qualifier rules

**Special Class: ANYSIZE Helter Skelter (Class 45):** Dogs may only enter this class if they are not entered in any other classes at the show, including any other classes designated as ‘Special’. The course will not include: Tyre, Weaves or Long Jump. Jump heights will be set at Medium (400mm), Small (300mm) & Micro (200mm) and handlers may choose at which height to run their dog(s), however they must be available for their run while the jumps are set at that height – order will be shown on the ring plan. Results will be combined for all heights.

**In all special classes, standard rules and marking will apply unless otherwise stated. Wins, places and clear rounds in special classes will not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at Kennel Club shows.**

## **SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/Authority to Compete (ATC) number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the competitor.
3. Entry Fees: £4.75 per dog per class, (helping WAS members £2.25 per dog per class). Pairs: £9.50 per pair, (helping WAS members £4.50 per pair).
4. Awards as listed under sponsors’ rules: The Agility Club, The Kennel Club, Jewlnick Leather, Country Shows Agility. In all other classes rosettes will be awarded from 1st to 10% of entry and trophies dependent on class size. WAS will also add rosettes to sponsored classes to 10% of entry. No prize money is on offer.
5. Internet entries will be accepted via [www.agilityshows.online](http://www.agilityshows.online) or by paper to the address on the entry form.
6. The Committee of Worcester Agility Society reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel club licensed Agility Shows.
8. A dog must not compete more than once in a class, including special classes.
9. Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged 4 calendar months and over. Dogs must be KC registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
10. No bitch in season is allowed to compete at Limited, Open, Premier or Championship Agility Shows. However, bitches in season can compete at quarter finals, semi-finals and finals of Kennel Club Prestige Events, except events held under YKC rules.
11. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the competition is forbidden
12. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling at any time within the boundaries of the show.
13. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half slip collar or lead when under test. A single flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
14. Should any judge be unable to fulfil their appointment, the committee reserve the right to appoint another judge.
15. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
16. Classes are sponsored as listed in the schedule of classes.
17. Detailed rules for The Kennel Club Small Dog Agility Stakes, The Kennel Club Medium Dog Agility Stakes and The Kennel Intermediate Dog Agility Stakes are listed in the next section of this schedule.
18. Kennel Club Standard Marking Regulations will apply for all standard classes.
19. See Rules for classes 45 and 46 set out elsewhere in this schedule.
20. The height limit for dogs
  - a) Large dog classes – for dogs measuring over 500mm at the withers
  - b) Intermediate dog classes – for dogs measuring over 430mm and measuring 500mm or under at the withers
  - c) Medium dog classes – for dogs measuring over 350mm and measuring 430mm or under at the withers
  - d) Small dog classes – for dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers.

21. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the show at which they are judging. Dogs may be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
22. Removal of dogs from competition: Following discussion between the show management and/or a veterinary surgeon, a dog shall be prevented from competing and/or removed from the Show if it is:
  - a) A bitch in season.
  - b) Suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
  - c) Interfering with the safety of or the chances of winning of an opponent.
  - d) Of such temperament or is so much out of control as to be a danger to safety of any person or animal.
  - e) Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues to compete.

The circumstances of such a removal shall be recorded in the competition / show Incident Book and submitted to the Kennel Club.
23. Dog Agility is a competitive and physically strenuous activity. It is the responsibility of the owner / handler to ensure their dog is 'fit for function' and that they themselves are fit to take part. By signing the entry form you confirm that to the best of your knowledge your dog is fit and able to take part in Agility classes on the day of the show.
24. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition ie **25th April 2023**, shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number of classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor will be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
25. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
26. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the Society will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
27. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand while the dog is under test and food shall not be given to the dog whilst in the ring. Competitors are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilst under test.
28. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
29. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
30. Passes are not required to gain entry to the show.
31. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease - No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during 21 days prior to the competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and /or dealt with under the Kennel Club Rule A11.
32. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
33. Animals in Event: No other animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the Board. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming that the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under control at all times.
34. A pay on the day class may be held if time and weather permits.
35. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows, this ring will be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
36. Welfare of Dogs  
An exhibitor/competitor whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog[s] are met, and should not knowingly put their dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this regulation may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any Agility Show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue and within the precincts of the show.
37. All dogs are entered at the show at their owner's risk and whilst every care will be taken, Worcester Agility Society will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury, howsoever caused, to dogs, persons or property whilst at the show.
38. Dogs will be received on the show site any time after 7.30am. Please note that the gates will be locked prior to this time and early arrivals may not be permitted entry to the site until after 7.30am
39. Health and Safety: Competitors and spectators are reminded that, just as Worcester Agility Society has a responsibility to ensure the health and safety of all those attending their event, competitors run at their own risk if conditions are not ideal and have a duty and responsibility for their own safety. They are therefore expected to take great care to avoid guide ropes, uneven surfaces and other hazards, which are inevitable and integral elements of an agility dog show. Those bringing and using portable items of equipment such as folding chairs, cages, and gazebos also have a responsibility to ensure that their equipment and collapsible furniture is used and erected safely and does not constitute a hazard to others. Competitors are also reminded that they should wear appropriate clothing and footwear for the prevailing conditions on the site.
40. The show organisers or their authorised agents may make results from this show publicly available and share results with third parties for the same purpose.
41. Children under the age of 11 are the responsibility of and must be accompanied at all times by a parent or guardian including when competing.

*In case of cancellation of the show within seven days of the show date, notification will be sent to the relevant web sites and posted on applicable facebook groups where possible. It will be the competitor's responsibility to check with these services if continuation of the show is in doubt.*

## DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog always stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated and this could lead to dire results.

Please look after your dog's welfare.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

## Rules for Qualifiers



### THE AGILITY CLUB STARTERS AGILITY CHALLENGE 2023

#### **Agility Club Large, Intermediate, Medium & Small Starters Agility Challenge Rules.**

- 1/ The competition will be run under the relevant Kennel Club Regulations in force at that time. Handlers will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations. Dogs will compete at their measured height. **This class will run as a Graded 1 and 2 agility class.**
- 2/ Each Heat is open to all Grade 1-2 dogs of the correct size for each heat, each heat will offer awards for the heights on offer as follows;  
Rosettes to a minimum of 10%,  
Trophies <30 = 1<sup>st</sup>, between 30 and 60 = 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup>, over 60 = 1<sup>st</sup> – 3<sup>rd</sup>
- 3/ ONLY dogs handled by an Agility Club member at the time of competing (**date of joining/renewal must be prior to the first day of the show**) may qualify for the Final. In order to compete in the Final you must also be a current member of The Agility Club on the day of the final.
- 4/ The competition will normally consist of up to twenty Heats. The **highest placed** Agility Club member in each Heat will go through to the Final, providing they have achieved an awarded place as detailed in paragraph 2.
- 5/ Both handler and dog may only qualify once for each height Final. Each handler and dog pairing may only qualify once for the Final. In the event of the highest placed dog(s) having qualified previously, the next highest placed dog will qualify. *The Agility Club reserves the right to call on the next placed Agility Club member if the highest placed is unable to attend the final.*

(W.A.S. will provide additional trophies and rosettes according to class size)



## Agility Challenge 2023 Rules



An Agility competition for large dogs Grades 1 – 4 jumping 600mm held using Kennel Club Ltd Rules & Regulations.

There will be qualifying heats (5 partnerships per qualifier) who are invited to compete at the Agility Challenge Grand Final to be held on Sunday 24 September 2023 at The Malvern Autumn Show, Three Counties Showground, Malvern WR13 6NW.

### JEWLNICK JUMP AND TWIST PAIRS RULES 2023

1. This class is open to pairs of the same height, grades 1-7. It is open to Small, Medium, Intermediate and Large dogs.
2. It is a combined class with one set of awards
3. One dog will complete an agility course and the other dog a jumping course
4. The judge will decide which course will be run first.
5. The agility course shall consist of 15 obstacles and must include three contacts (they do not have to be three different pieces of agility equipment) and the dog must complete twelve weaves.
6. The jumping course shall consist of fifteen obstacles one of which must be twelve weaves.
7. There will be a baton exchange. A faulty baton exchange will incur 20 faults. The exchange to take place after the first dog has finished. There is no box.
8. If someone loses their Pairs partner they may run with another partner provided **the dog is entered in the show and in the Pairs class.**
9. Marking will be standard. However, should either dog be eliminated, the whole pair will be eliminated.
10. The first FOUR pairs will qualify for the final. Only the original handlers and dogs may compete in the final, there can be no substitutions.
11. Once a pair has qualified they may enter other heats for competition but the place in the final will be awarded to the next highest placed pair who have not already qualified.
12. The final will be held at Southam Agility Show in September 2023.

At the next roundabout take the third exit 'Bromwich Road' (Jet garage on your left) Continue to traffic lights, go straight over and get into left hand lane of this one way system, bear left at Mac Donalds , signed to Tenbury Wells (Hylton Road - A443), beware of speed camera! Continue on the A443 through Hallow village, past Grimley raceway, then after approx ¾ mile look out for signs to Top Barn farm on your right.
